Rules for the New Gloucester Public Library 2023 Reading Challenge: The Display Dozen

Who can participate?

Adults, teens, and children can all participate—and win prizes!

How do I get a Library Reading Challenge sheet?

Download a sheet at www.newgloucesterlibrary.org/programs or pick one up at the Library.

How does the reading challenge work?

- The Library creates displays of books throughout the year—some are on themes/topics and others are of new books. Your challenge is to read 12 titles from any library displays this year.
- Keep track of the library display books you read (or have read to you) in 2023 and write the title and author in the matching square.
- A title can only be used once.

Does it matter what format I read?

No. Physical books, e-books, audiobooks, or e-audiobooks can be used to complete the challenge. You can read children's, young adult, or adult books—no matter your age.

How do I win?

Once you complete a sheet, submit it to the Library. For each sheet you get 1 entry to win. Three \$25 gift cards will be awarded: one for adults, one for teens, and one for children.

Books must be read between January 1 and December 31, 2023.
